Kyocera presents its ceramic innovations at The Wire Show 2022

Kyoto/London, 08. June 2022. KYOCERA Fineceramics Precision GmbH will be attending the Wire 2022 trade fair in Düsseldorf from 20th to 24th June as an exhibitor. More than 1,300 exhibitors will present their products, technologies, and solutions to more than 38,000 trade visitors at the international trade fair for wires and cables. Kyocera will be presenting its wide range of products at stand H06 in hall 10 and experts will be on hand to provide advice on tailored solutions.

Individual solutions and components tailored to customer requirements

At its stand, the Japanese manufacturer of fine ceramics will be exhibiting tools and equipment for the production of non-ferrous wire and for further processing into cable products, which are manufactured at the two German sites in Selb and Mannheim. These include drawing tools such as drawing rings, cones and capstans, bending and expanding mandrels, and drawing dies. Kyocera also manufactures components according to customer specifications: The experts on site will provide professional advice to interested parties on all questions relating to wire drawing and will work with customers to find the ideal material for every solution - from aluminium oxide, silicon carbide, silicon nitride, or zirconium oxide.

The company also offers the components with a variety of surfaces for different applications. This means that it is possible to either polish the ceramic to an extremely fine finish in order to reduce friction, or to anneal it after grinding in order to further improve the wear resistance of the component. Kyocera is also one of the first manufacturers to offer its drawing tools in both yellow and white ceramics to suit customer requirements.
